**Testimony to the Senate Assessment and Taxation Committee**

Dear Chair & members of the committee,

As a parent of two children who attended their entire K-12 years in schools that were not constitutionally funded due to major cuts to the state budget, first from a recession and then from an ill-advised tax experiment, I feel compelled to write to you today.

I urge you to oppose bill SB 169. We cannot afford another tax experiment in Kansas.

This tax proposal, although beneficial to wealthy Kansans and corporations, would hurt middle- and low-income Kansans and greatly reduce the state general fund.

For a similar bill in the House, bill HB 2061, the Kansas Division of Budget has estimated a decrease in state revenues of \$1.5 billion. This will put our state at risk of not meeting its obligations and the needs of its citizens. We've been through a tax experiment before and we know what it did to our bond rating, our infrastructure, and our kids in public schools.

Our state now has a healthy budget. If you really want to help Kansans, stay focused on initiatives such as:

- Eliminating the food sales tax
- Providing an education tax holiday
- Fully funding special education
- Investing in mental health
- Investing in infrastructure

Legislators did the right thing in 2017 when they reversed the previous tax cuts that decimated our state budget. Please vote no on Bill SB 169.
