In accordance with KSA 75-3715a, the following fiscal note concerning HB 2676 is respectfully submitted to your committee.

As recommended by the Governor's Office of the Repealer, HB 2676 would repeal KSA 79-409, which states that if a land owner neglects or refused to furnish a description of a tract of land when requested by the county clerk, the county surveyor would provide the information. The cost of the survey would be reported to the county clerk and added to the property taxes.

HB 2676 is of a technical nature; therefore, enactment of HB 2676 would have no fiscal effect.
