Testimony before the Kansas House of Representatives Committee on Government Efficiencies on HB 2703 Chairman Mike Burgess Testimony presented by: Secretary Dennis Taylor, Kansas Department of Administration February 16, 2012

Mr. Chairman: It is a privilege and an honor to address the Committee on Government Efficiencies today regarding HB 2703. HB 2703 is the result of Governor Brownback's initiative to repeal outmoded, unreasonable, duplicative, onerous or unduly burdensome statutes and regulations. HB 2703 encompasses statutes that fall within the category of being outmoded.

HB 2703 lists the following statutes for repeal: K.S.A. 75-4602, K.S.A. 75-4607, K.S.A. 75-4615, K.S.A. 75-4616 and K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 75-4603. These statutes address the operation of a central motor pool for state agencies. The central motor pool was eliminated under the Sebelius administration, therefore, these statutes are neither in use nor necessary.

The Office of the Repealer urges favorable consideration of HB 2703.
