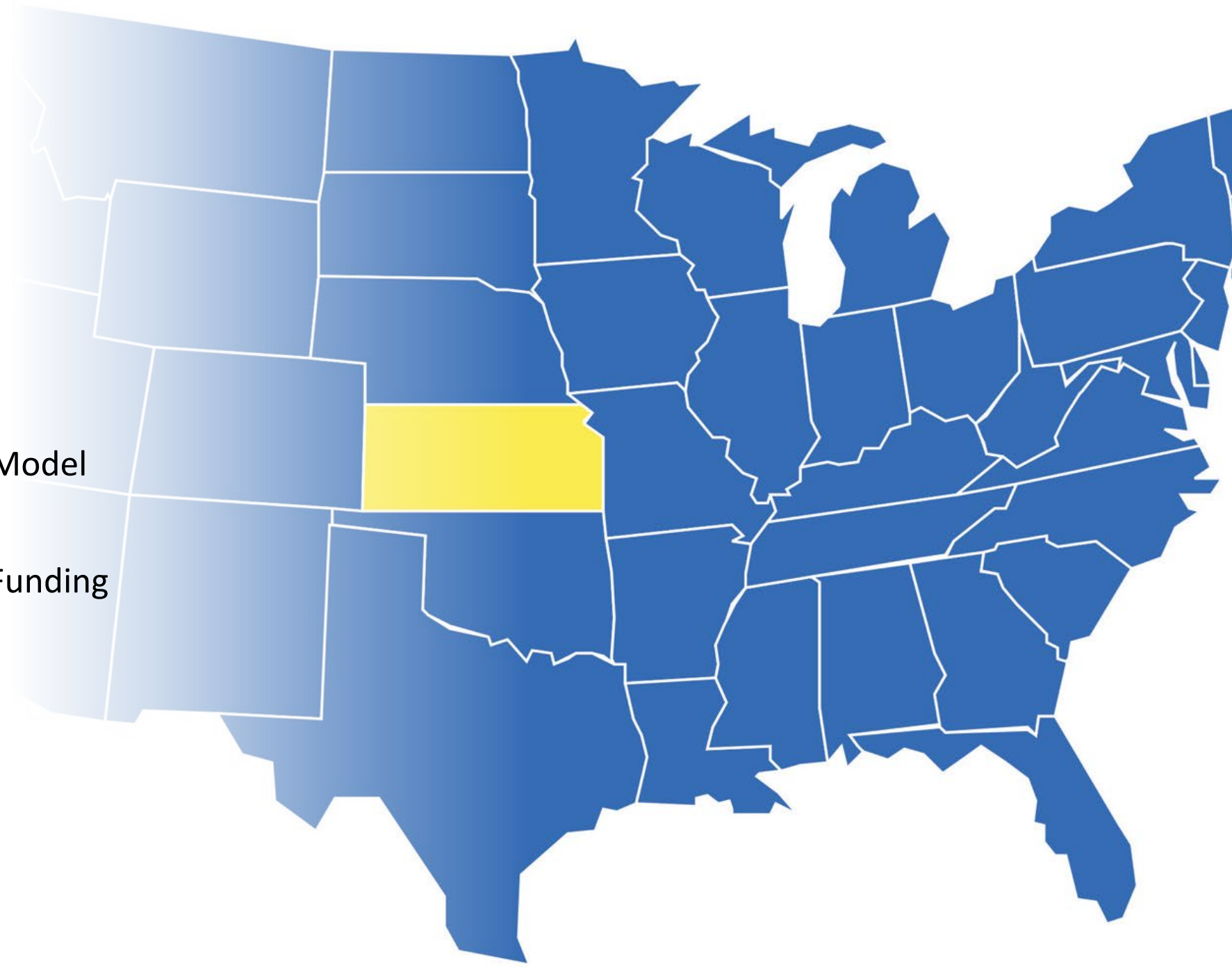

Community Corrections Funding - Adult



- K.S.A. 75-52,111
 - Grants based on staffing levels, active cases, administrative costs, funded contracts for services, client numbers, travel costs...
- K.S.A. 75-52,112
 - Goal of achieving and maintaining a supervision success rate of at least 75% or improving by at least 3% from previous year

- K.S.A. 75-7053
 - Grants based on staffing levels, active cases, administrative costs, funded contracts for services, client numbers, travel costs...

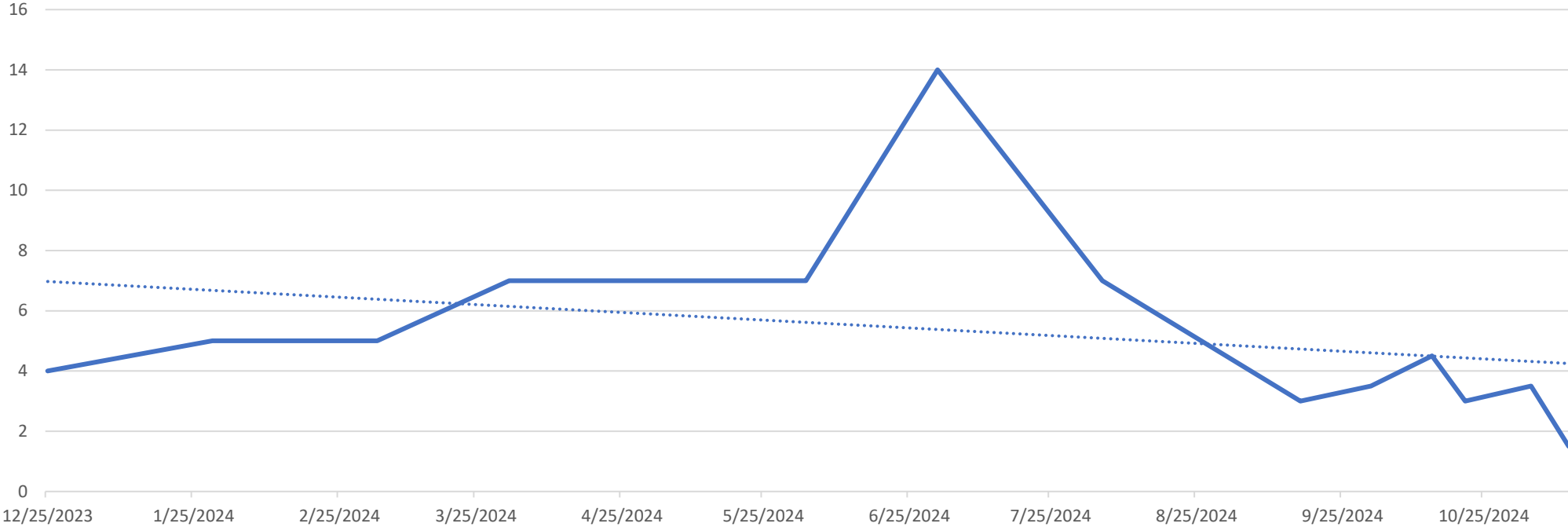
- Supervises individuals released from Kansas facilities
